April 2017

# Help Fill School Kits for Needy Children

CCOB's Missions Board is sponsoring a project through Church World Service to provide basic school kits for children in impoverished communities and refugee camps. Scenes of families made homeless by war and natural disasters and pictures of refugee camps with their rows of tents or crude shelters are all too familiar in newspapers and on television. The Board is hoping many members and friends of Bristol Church will volunteer to fill the kits to give these children some of the basic tools for learning. It may be a small gesture, but it is one that could make a significant difference in the life of a child.

Church World Service has a specific list of supplies needed to fill each bag. The Missions Board purchased cloth bags and will have them available on Sunday, March 26, and subsequent Sundays. Attached to each bag will be a list of the required supplies. The filled bags are due back no later than April 30, so that they can be delivered to the collection point, Woodford Congregational Church in Portland.

All the materials to fill the bags are to be purchased new. All items must be as specified and no additional items or personal notes should be included. CWS estimates the cost of the supplies to be approximately \$15. The Missions Board asks that, if possible, \$2.00 be attached by paper clip to each bag when it is returned to cover the cost of purchasing the bags.

Following is a list of the items to fill the kits: one pair of blunt scissors, three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages, one 30 centimeter - 12 inch ruler, one hand held pencil sharpener, one large eraser, six unsharpened pencils with erasers, and one box of 24 crayons (not larger or smaller).
