A Pilgrim's Ponderings April, 2018

Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and on the sea, and all that is in them, singing: "To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, for ever and ever."

Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ:

Greetings to each and every one of you in the blessed Name of our resurrected Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ!

Easter was once again a glorious and joyful celebration here in "beautiful downtown Bristol Mills." We heard the good news that the tomb is empty, death has lost its sting, and because He lives, we can live fully today and face tomorrow with the truth of life's victory over death. The worship celebration in our lovely, classic New England sanctuary was full of joyful people singing, praying, passing the peace, breaking and sharing the bread and cup of Holy Communion, listening to a hope-filled message, and even singing "Happy Birthday" to this month's honorees, as is our relatively new custom on the first Sunday of every month. I truly believe God was honored as we worshipped the Lord in Spirit and in truth.

But what happens after all the singing and praying and preaching dies down? What next? For many people, perhaps for too many Christians, Easter is only an event which happened two millennia ago, celebrated once a year, either in March or April. That's it. Easter is history. See you again next year at this time. It's simply an annual holiday, a civic celebration, more on the lines of Mother's Day, Memorial Day, or the Fourth of July.

The Easter once-a-year <u>event</u> needs to become the Easter every day <u>experience</u>. Several years ago a reputable polling firm conducted a survey of twenty six mainline denominations (UCC, American Baptists, United Methodists, etc.) attempting to determine the number one reason why visitors return and church the church. Are you ready for the answer? It all has to do with Easter. The number one reason is "the congregation <u>acts like it really believes that Jesus is alive</u>" through a collective effervescence that pervades everything that is done."

Every time we gather for worship, prayer, and discipleship we experience Easter. Every time we season our faith with the flavor of Godly humor we experience Easter. Every time a soul is won to Christ, we experience Easter. Every time the hungry are fed and the naked clothed and a cup of cold water is given in Jesus' name, we experience Easter. Only the calendar says Easter comes but once a year!

Christ is risen. He is risen indeed! Experience Easter every day of the year.
