"View From the Pulpit" February, 2017

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ!

Here on the coast we have been "wintering well." Granted, we still have all of February, March, and sometimes even April to contend with before we sound the all clear signal. We've had a few cold spells but little snow. January was warm, by Maine standards. I haven't checked the long range forecast yet, but it seems reasonable to assume that we are going to get our fair share of the white stuff before Town Meeting in March, Easter in April, and black flies in May! Here in New England, we've learned to roll with the meteorological punches.

The longer I'm a Christian the more I've learned (by the grace of God) to roll with spiritual, ecclesiastical, and existential punches. **Spiritual** punches, like seasons of deep, gratifying closeness with God and seasons of shallow, unfulfilling distance from the Lord. **Ecclesiastical** (Greek for "church") punches, like times when the church's vision for ministry is clear and other times when we seem to be stuck in institutional mud, unsure of which direction to take. **Existential** punches, like periods of rejoicing in the goodness of life and other eras when life turns difficult. Christians are people who have learned to roll with all sorts of punches, to anticipate, even long for what is expected; to prepare for, or expect, the unexpected.

For example, we might expect, perhaps even long for, the church to continue its seasonal routines: Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter, the return of good friends, like the Snow Birds, as summer approaches; bean suppers and the Church Fair and bake sales in the fall. The church year means preparing for and celebrating our Lord's incarnation, His sacrificial death and joyous resurrection. It also includes fellowship events, service projects, committee and board meetings, and a host of other activities too numerous to mention here.

Rolling with the punches also means that we need to be prepared to expect the unexpected. When we least expect it, God often surprises us by taking us out of our comfort zones by showing us a new thing He is doing in our midst. God is active, not dormant. The Lord continues to reach out to us with unconditional love, amazing grace, tender compassion, phenomenal forgiveness, holy righteousness, and profound wisdom. The Spirit of God is blowing like a mighty wind. We don't know where it comes from or where it is going, but when the
