### A Pilgrim's Ponderings June, 2018

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." Romans 8:28, NIV

Greetings in the Lord, Sisters & Brothers in Christ.

Here on the coast of Maine we are blessed with some excellent hospitals: **Miles Memorial** in Damariscotta, **Midcoast** in Brunswick, and **Penn Bay** in Rockland. **Maine Med** in Portland and **Maine General** in Augusta are also fine facilities. For more complicated or specialized treatment, we have the option to go to **Boston**, home to some of the finest hospitals in the United States, if not the world.

People go to the hospital because they are ill in one way or another. While there, the Church prays for the afflicted to be comforted, the sick to be healed, the dying to be tenderly loved, and for all to experience what the Scriptures describe as "the peace which passes all understanding." It is in this medical setting where God's presence is so often desperately needed.

Hospital visits are part and parcel of what it means to be a pastor. I've often thought of the hospital as my "second parish." Being in a hospital setting as a visiting clergy seems about as familiar and important to me as leading worship in our beautiful New England sanctuary. I go to the hospital as Christ's servant representing the local church to which I have been called. I offer prayer and a short reading from the Bible. Sometimes I bring Communion. I try to listen and offer reassurance. Most of all, my pastoral presence is a visible reminder of God's presence. We all need to know that the God who creates, saves, and sustains is right there with us in the operating room, recovery, ICU, the hallways, patients rooms, and even the gift shop and cafeteria.

Recently, I experienced the Lord's presence in a powerful way while visiting one of our CCOB church members in the hospital. We visited and talked for quite some time. Towards the end of our conversation, this Godly person said to me, "Jim, I've been through a lot in my life and I suspect you have too in yours. That's why Romans 8:28 is so important to me." Such a faithful statement sounded like the angels in heaven giving glory to God in the highest! Here I was, expecting once again to be the one designated by God to do the ministering, and

I needed to hear that our loving God truly does "work for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." Sometimes we wonder exactly how much God is working in our lives, and if He is, where's the evidence? I needed to listen to one of my "flock" testify to the faith which has sustained them through thick and thin. The Lord reminded me through this Christian's witness that the Bible truly is the living Word of the living God.

Thank God for hospitals and their staff. They are agents of God's healing. One more thing: if you're ever in the hospital and would like a visit, please let me know. The hospital is my "second parish." God is present everywhere in His creation. To God be the glory, great things He has done, and is doing!
